

# East Cobb Pipeline Project

## Frequently Asked Questions

*What days of the week and during what hours will construction take place?*

– Crews' typical work schedule will be Monday – Friday, 7am – 6pm, with occasional periods of 24-hour work. Barricades will remain in place 24/7. If work is delayed by rain or other issues, Saturday work might be authorized so the project can stay on schedule.

### TRAFFIC ISSUES

*What will happen to traffic? Will roads or lanes be closed?*

– Motorists can expect lane closures throughout the project within the construction segments. Lane closure segments will typically be about 1,000 to 3,000 feet long.

– Cobb County Police will be on hand to direct traffic at intersections to ensure smooth traffic flow.

*Will detours and alternate routes be provided?*

– There are no official alternate routes for sections 1 and 2 of the project. Motorists should expect delays along the construction route and therefore allow themselves extra time.

– For the safety of neighborhood residents, we ask motorists not to cut through residential streets.

– In the event of full road closures, at least one official detour will be provided, and police will be on hand to assist.

*Will traffic signals be affected?*

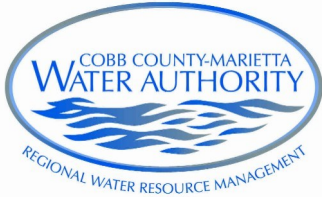
– CCMWA and our contractor are coordinating with Cobb County Department of Transportation (DOT) to minimize any impact on traffic signals. Some signals might be temporarily affected by construction, but Cobb County Police will be directing traffic at intersections to during those times to ensure safe traffic flow.
